

Dear Client,

You have been placed on Medical Surveillance for Inactive Tuberculosis (TB) by Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC).

At this point, you should have already spoken with a public health nurse in the TB Program who has instructed you to do the following:

1. When to see a Doctor:

- If you qualify for an Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP), you can wait 90 days until you receive your OHIP card to make an appointment with a doctor. Please have the doctor complete the Physician Report found in this package.
- If you *do not* qualify for OHIP, make an appointment as soon as possible. Please have the doctor complete the Physician Report found in this package. You will have to pay for the appointment.
- If your CIC letter has been stamped as **urgent** or you are experiencing symptoms of TB, which may include night sweats, fever, cough or coughing up blood, call Peel Public Health and see a doctor **immediately** with this package. You will have to pay for the appointment.

2. What to do after you see a Doctor:

- Keep a copy of all documents
- Send the completed Physician Report within six months or CIC will be notified and your file will be closed. Fax or mail to:
