

Construction update

Construction of the Seniors Health and Wellness Village (SHWV) at Peel Manor continues to progress. Overall, construction is approximately 95% complete.

Building commissioning, which is a process that ensures that everything is performing and operating as intended, has commenced.

Interior finishes, mechanical systems, and electrical systems on floors 2 to 4 have seen considerable progress and are nearing completion. Landscaping outside has also progressed to an advanced stage. Currently, the contractor is focused on completing the interior works on the first floor and lower level.

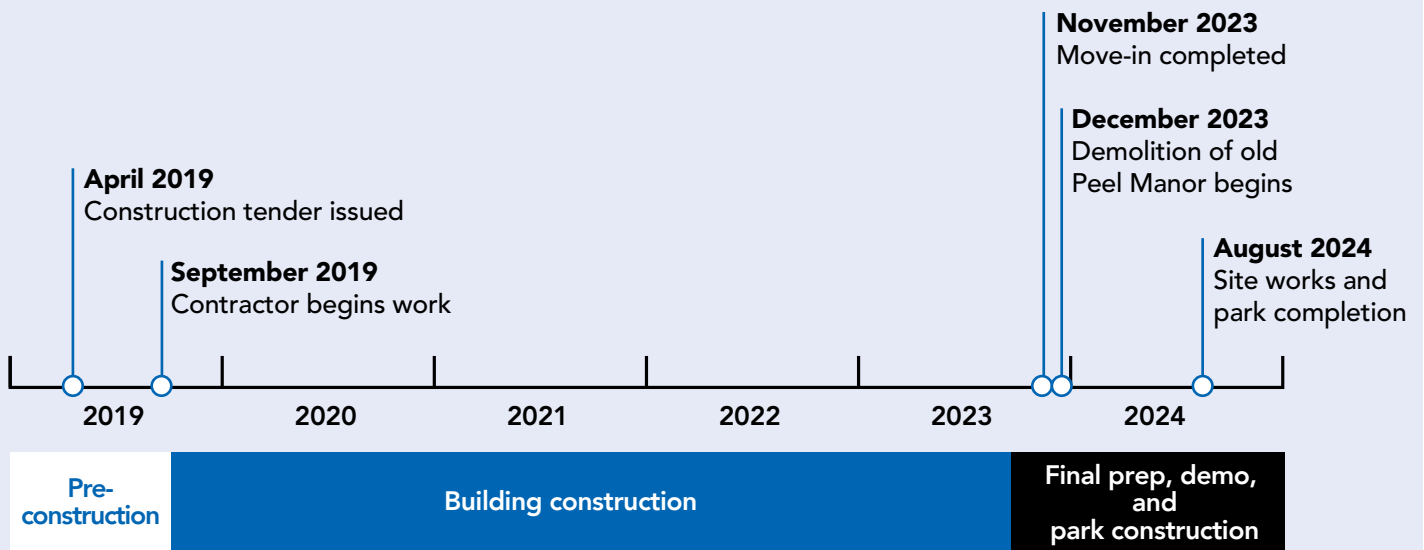

Revised timeline

Construction on the SHWV at Peel Manor was intended to be substantially completed in May 2023. Unfortunately, due to construction-related delays, substantial completion will take an additional 2 to 3 months.

Due to this delay, the September 2023 target date for resident and staff move-in has been shifted to a later date in the fall (likely November 2023), with further delays still possible.

The updated timeline is as follows:



Move plan and resident room assignments

Planning and logistical work for the transition and move into the SHWV at Peel Manor is ongoing. Our goal is to ensure that the move is safe, secure, and uncomplicated for residents, families, and staff.

Resident room assignments are currently under review based on input received from residents and families. Due to the move-in day being postponed, resident room assignments will now be shared in September 2023. This additional time will be used to ensure the preferences of as many residents as possible are considered when assigning rooms.

More details about the move plan will be shared with stakeholders in the coming months.

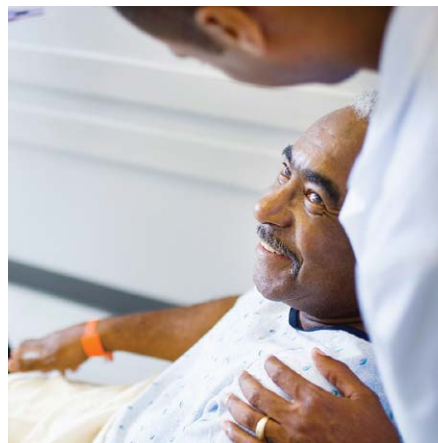
Transitional Behaviour Support Unit **update**

We are happy to confirm that the SHWV at Peel Manor will have an area designated for a Transitional Behavioural Support Unit (TBSU). A TBSU provides individuals living with dementia, who experience complex personal expressions/responsive behaviours with time-limited, specialized support in a safe, secure environment.

Residents in the TBSU will receive a comprehensive clinical assessment and treatments to enable them to return to their community or to enter/re-enter long term care.

The TBSU will also leverage the Butterfly model to provide person-centred care and ensure strong collaboration between interdisciplinary teams, family members, and the community.

We are currently waiting for additional funding from Ontario Health and a designation from the Ministry of Long-Term Care to operate the TBSU at Peel Manor. In the meantime, planning activities are underway. More information will be shared soon.



Artwork engagement results

The Peel Manor engagement team recently coordinated an “Art and Animation” session with LTC residents, ADS clients, and family members.

The goal of the session was to receive feedback regarding art styles participants most wanted to see at the SHWV at Peel Manor. Participants were also asked about which current Peel Manor art pieces they most wanted to see moved over to the SHWV, and what to do with the remaining pieces.

In total, 155 people participated in the session. The results were as follows:

The top 3 styles of art that participants wanted to see at the SHWV at Peel Manor are:

1. Landscape and Nature – 23.67%
2. Peel, Brampton, and Vintage – 18.36%
3. Family and Farm Life – 14.25%

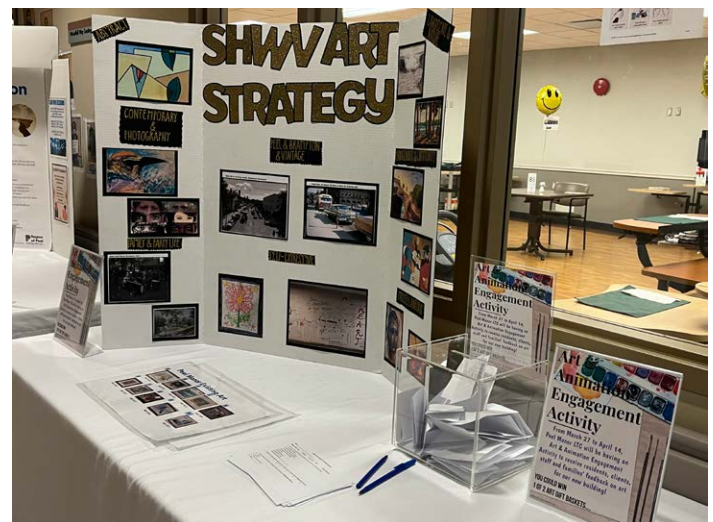
When participants were asked about what they wanted to see happen with Peel Manor’s existing art pieces that will not be moved to the new building, the results were:

1. Auction them (proceeds to Peel Manor Volunteer Auxiliary) – 36.77%
2. Offer them to another LTC home – 32.90%
3. Donate them – 24.52%

These results will be used to inform decisions regarding current and new art in the SHWV at Peel Manor. Thank you to everyone who participated.
