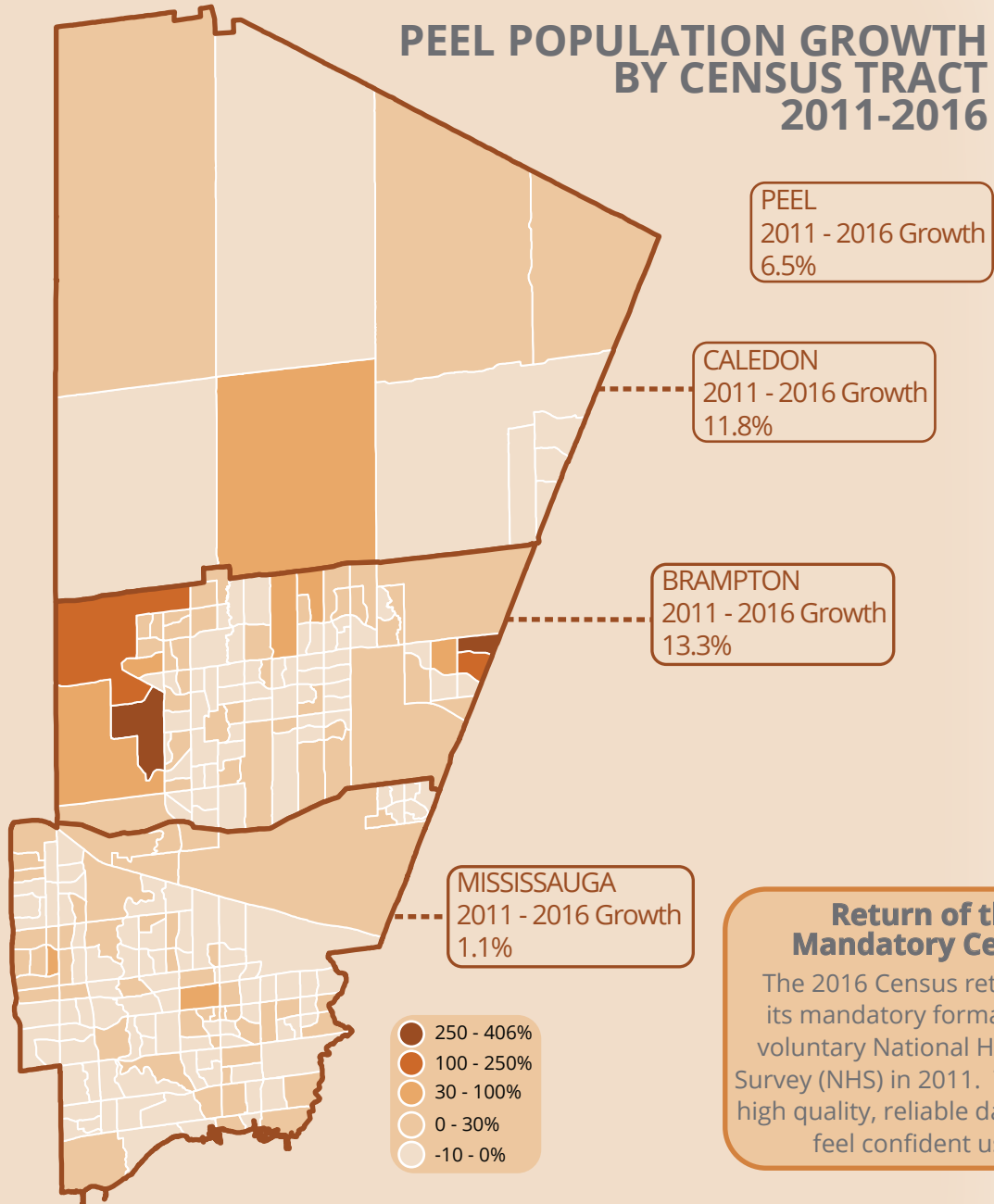


2016 CENSUS BULLETIN POPULATION & DWELLING COUNTS

This bulletin summarizes the 2016 census population (excluding undercount) and dwelling counts for Peel and the Greater Toronto Area (GTA). Data from the 2016 Census was collected across Canada in May 2016. From 2011 to 2016 the population of the GTA increased by 6.0% to 6.4 million people. **What about Peel?**

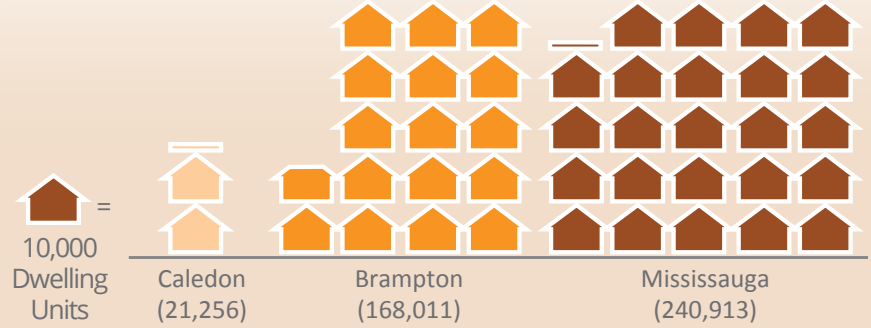
Return of the Mandatory Census

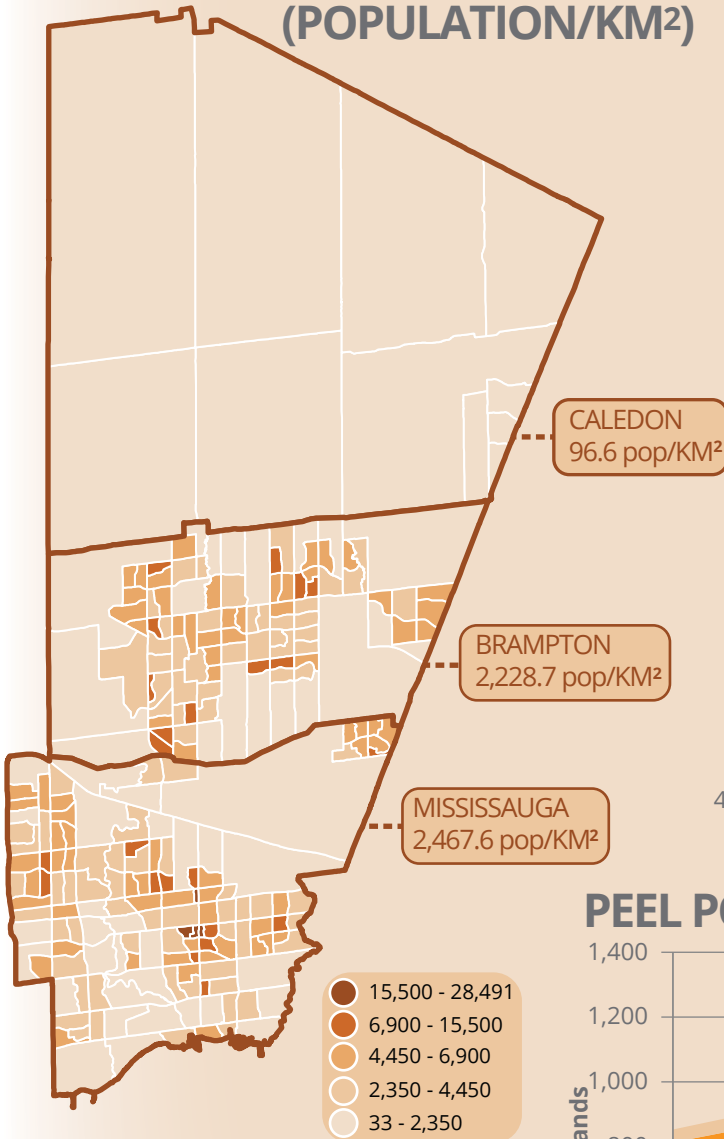

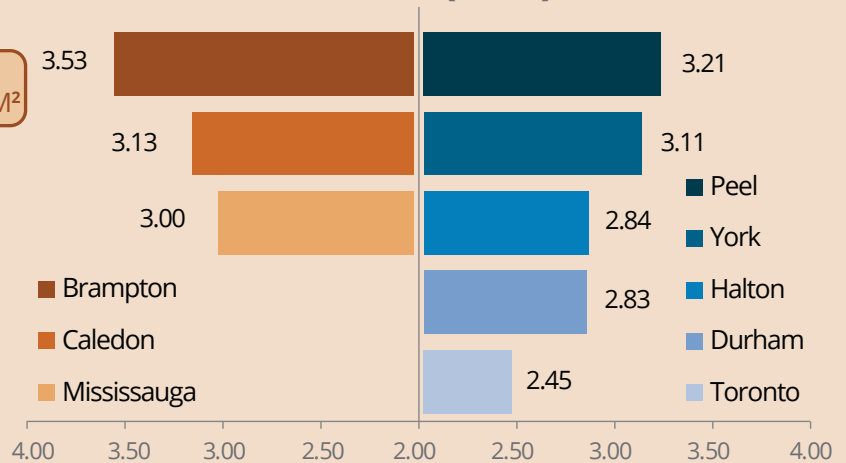

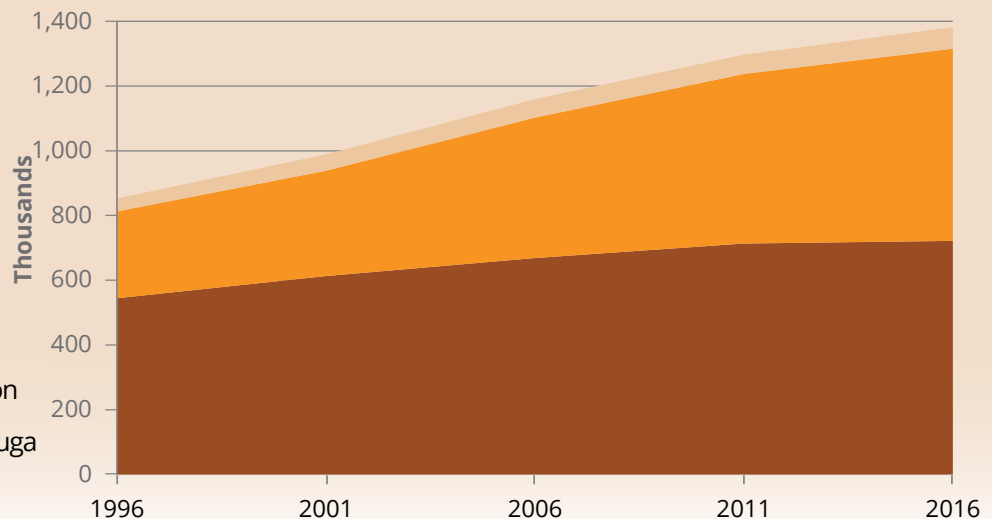

PEEL POPULATION COUNTS



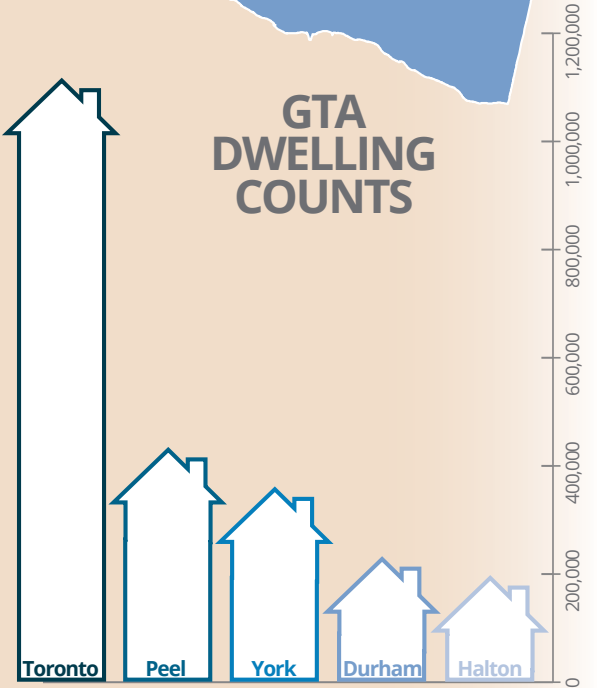
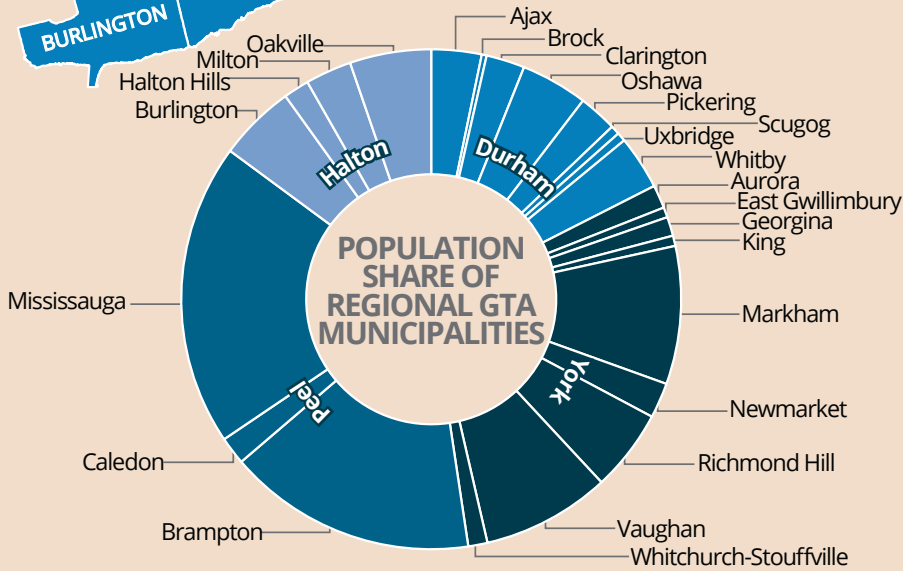
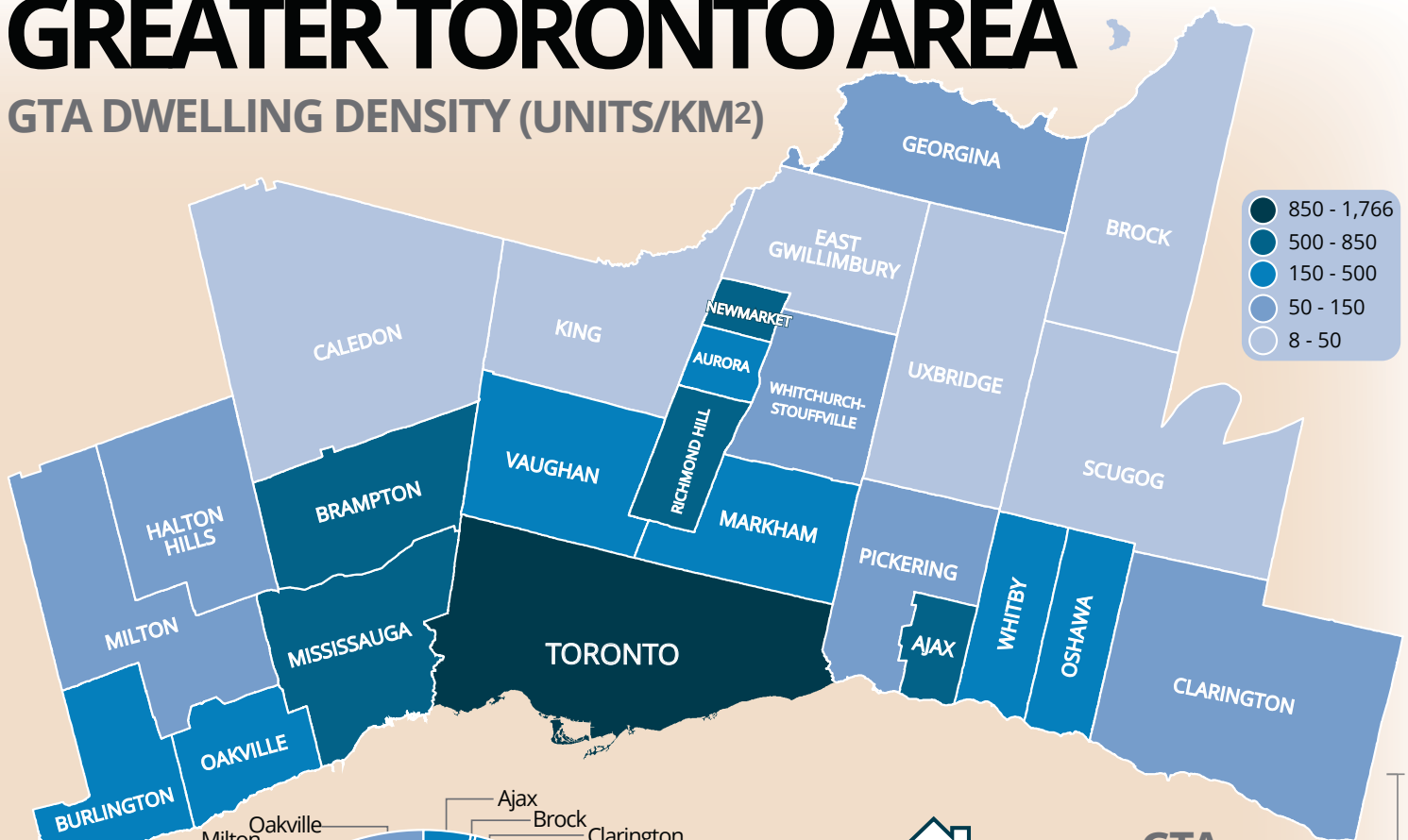

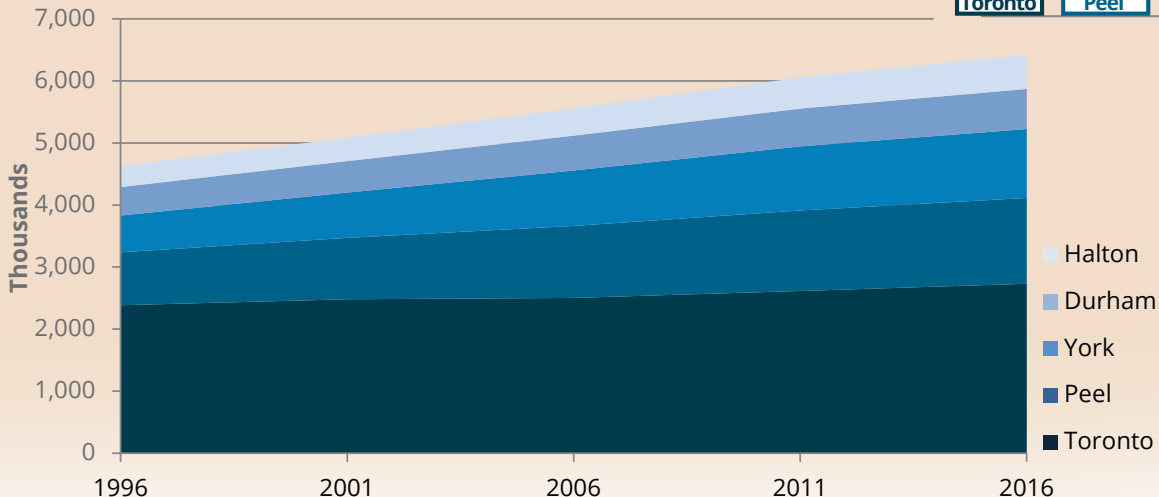

SUMMARY OF FACTS

During the five year period between 2011 and 2016, the population of Peel grew from 1,296,809¹ to 1,381,739, a growth rate of 6.5%. Peel has the second largest population in the GTA, behind Toronto (2,731,571). From 2011-2016, Peel's growth rate was 6.5%, which is lower than the 2006-2011 growth rate of 11.8%. Peel's residents comprised 21.5% of the total GTA population, which is the second largest share behind Toronto (42.6%). Peel's share of the GTA population increased only slightly from 21.4% in 2011 to 21.5% in 2016.

From 2011 to 2016, Mississauga's population grew 1.1% (713,443 to 721,599), while Brampton's grew 13.3% (523,906 to 593,638), and Caledon grew 11.8% (59,460 to 66,502). For Mississauga and Brampton, this is a lower growth rate than in the 2006-2011 period (6.7% and 20.8%, respectively), while Caledon's has increased (4.2%).

Mississauga accounted for 52.2% of Peel's population, while Brampton and Caledon accounted for 43.0% and 4.8%, respectively. Between 2011 and 2016, Brampton's and Caledon's shares of the Region's population increased, while Mississauga's share decreased.

According to the 2016 Census, there were 430,180 occupied private dwellings in Peel, an increase of 6.8% from 2011. Peel has the second highest number of occupied private dwelling units in the GTA, behind Toronto. The growth in occupied private dwellings ranks Peel third in the GTA, behind York (10.4%) and Halton (7.8%). Peel has a 17.7% share of the total occupied private dwellings in the GTA, which is the second largest share behind Toronto (45.9%). The average number of persons per occupied dwelling unit (PPU)³ has slightly decreased in Peel, from 3.22 to 3.21, but is still the highest in the GTA.

From 2011 to 2016 the number of occupied private dwellings increased by 2.7% in Mississauga (234,582 to 240,913); 12.6% in Brampton (149,270 to 168,011); and 11.4% in Caledon (19,086 to 21,256). Mississauga's persons per occupied dwelling unit decreased from 3.04 in 2011 to 3.00 in 2016. Persons per occupied dwelling unit increased in Brampton from 3.51 to 3.53 and in Caledon from 3.12 to 3.13.
