- 2. 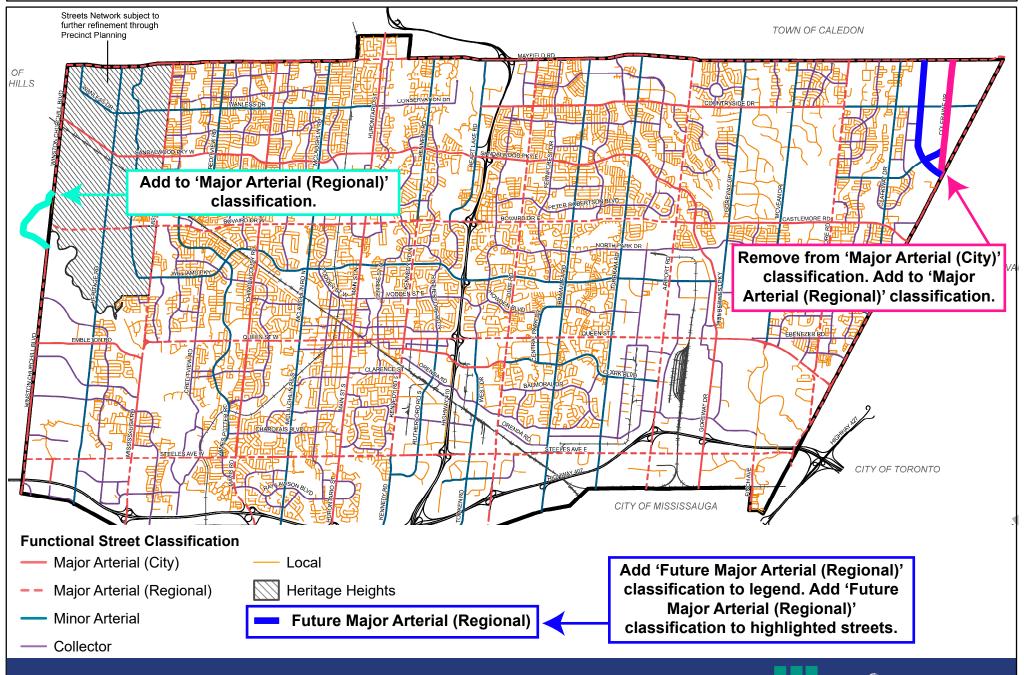


SCHEDULE 3B | TRANSIT NETWORK TO 2051

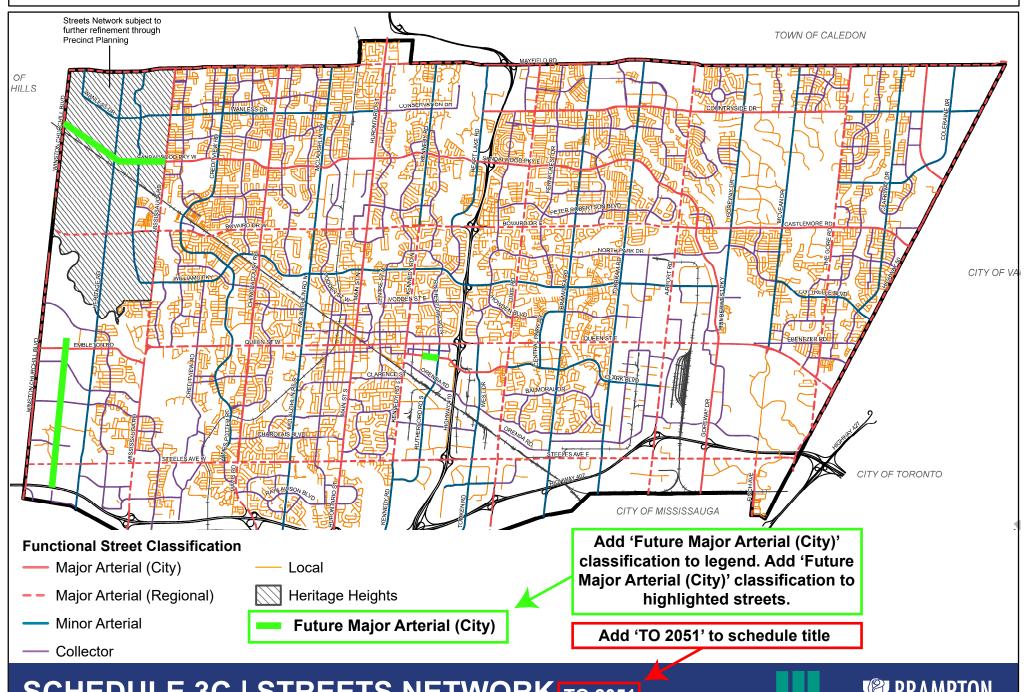




Attachment #10 - Schedule 3C | Streets Network



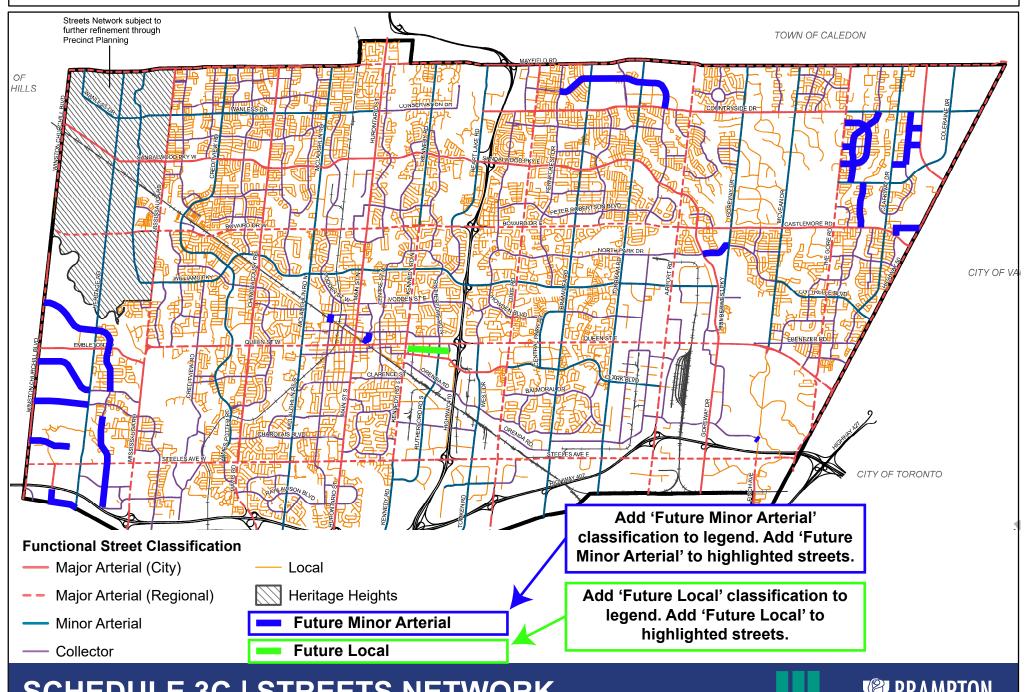

SCHEDULE 3C | STREETS NETWORK TO 2051



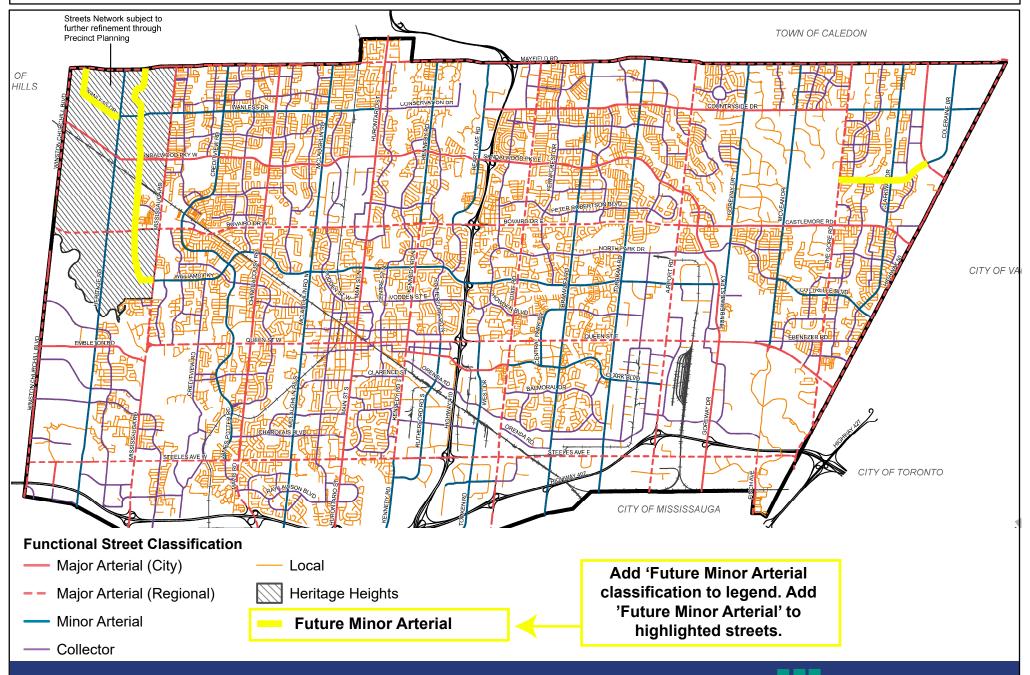

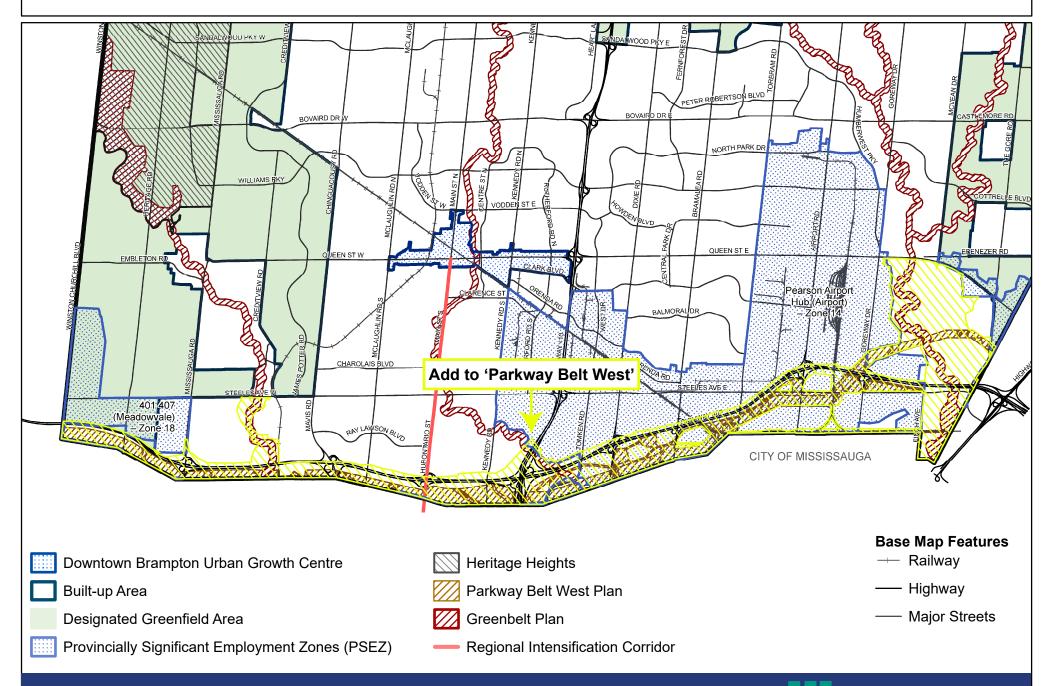

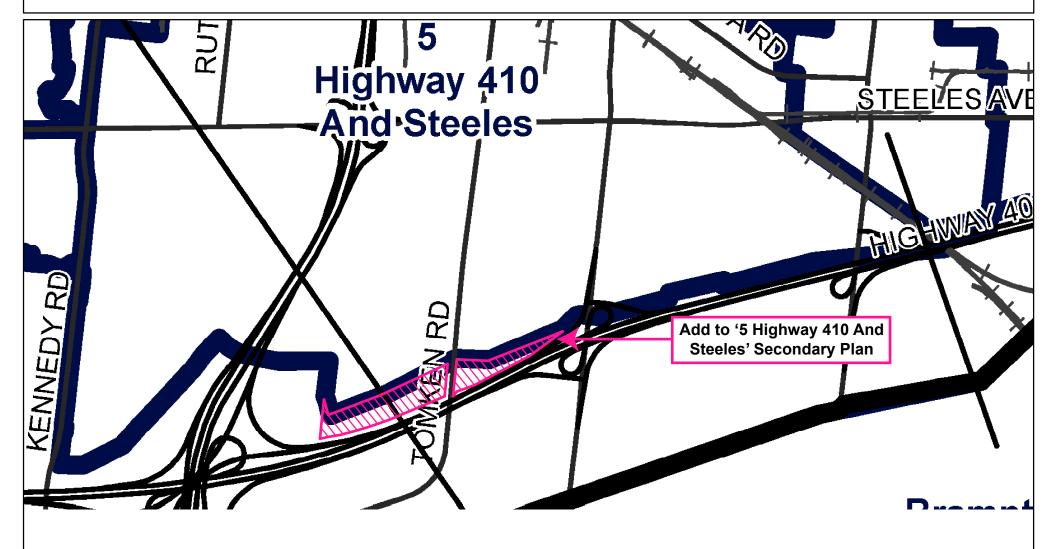


Attachment #14 - Schedule 5 | Provincial Plans & Policy Areas

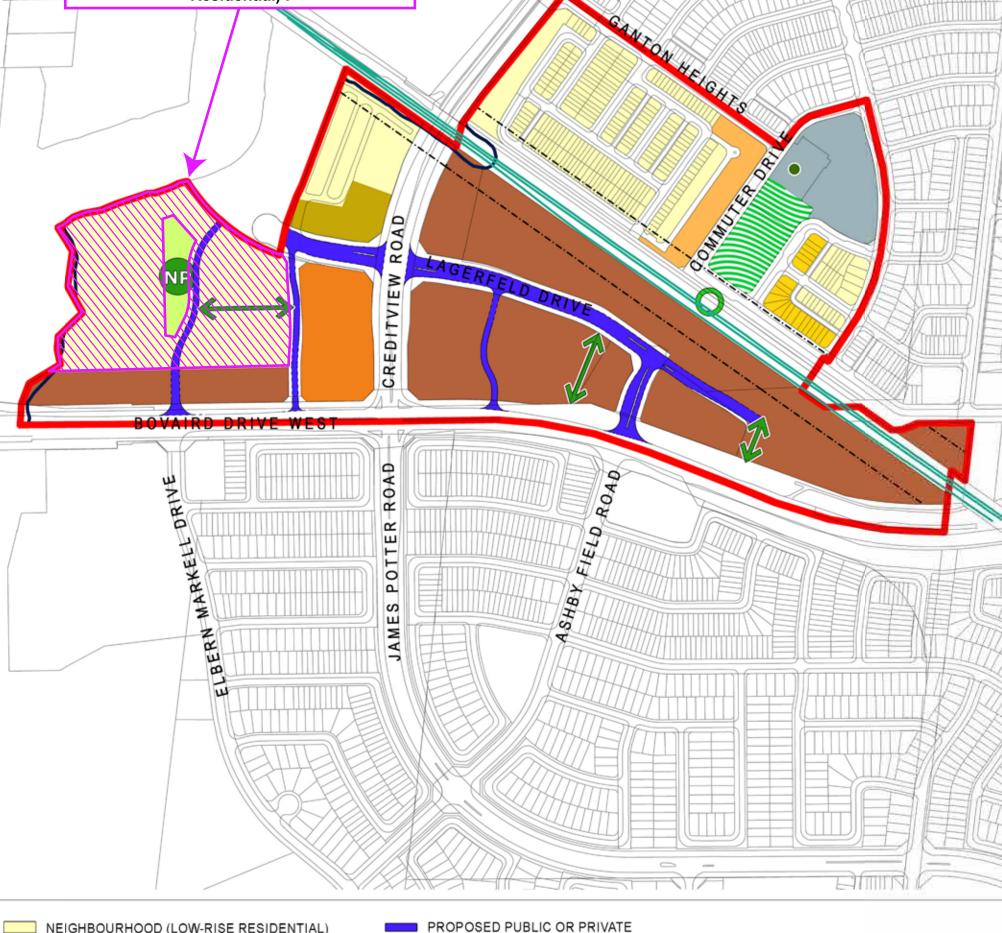

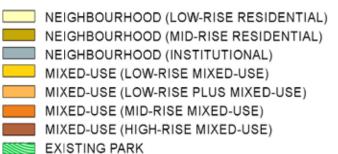

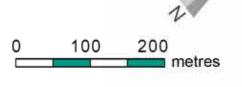
