

Construction update

We are thrilled to share that the construction of the Seniors Health and Wellness Village (SHWV) at Peel Manor reached an important milestone known as “substantial performance”. This is a contractual term that means that our construction vendor has reached a very high level of completion. With this milestone achieved, work is now underway to address minor deficiencies and any outstanding construction or changes.



SHWV Gallery at Existing Peel Manor - Floor Maps Now Posted

In preparation for the coming move into the SHWV at Peel Manor, and to support residents, families, and others in becoming more familiar with the future accommodations, we have posted large copies of the resident home area floor maps near the front entrance of the existing Peel Manor. The maps are in an area known as the “SHWV gallery” in the hallway leading to Huxley Town Hall.

We have also placed a plaque in the gallery recognizing the Innovation and Excellence Capital Project Award presented to the SHWV at Peel Manor Team. This award was presented at AdvantAge Ontario’s Annual Convention on April 17, 2024, and represents significant recognition for the Region of Peel. Ministry of LTC Inspection and Move Timing

As we approach the end of construction, we know that everyone is eager to know when we will be moving into the new building. There are several more construction and readiness checkpoints to clear before we can announce our formal move date.

Now that substantial performance has been achieved by our construction vendor, we have contacted the Ministry of Long-Term Care (LTC) to schedule their inspection team to review and approve the new facility. The Ministry inspection will be a multi-day review to ensure the new facility meets Ministry standards and is ready for resident occupancy. Soon after we have received approval from the Ministry to move in, we will be able to confirm a specific move date. At the moment, we anticipate that the move will occur later this fall.



Open Houses

Although the construction of the new building is almost complete, access remains highly restricted. The building will remain inaccessible up until after our move-in and we kindly ask all community members to refrain from entering the building.

We do, however, understand that many of our residents, clients, families, etc., would like to see the inside of the new building as soon as possible. To address this interest, we are aiming to organize a series of "open houses" during the summer. The exact dates and times for the open houses will be communicated soon to key stakeholders, including residents and families.

Community Facing Services and Expansion of Adult Day and Integrated Care Services

As part of the SHWW at Peel Manor, we are excited to be able to provide more services to support seniors to age at home. These will include community-facing services and expanded Adult Day Services (ADS) including Respite and integrated clinical care.

The community-facing services and accessible spaces for seniors, caregivers and others living in the community will include:

- A resource centre with access to information on health and social care services within the community.
- A hair salon supporting long-term care residents, adult day services clients, and appointments available for community members.
- Meeting spaces and outdoor green spaces.

ADS provides a full range of person-centred social, recreational, and therapeutic activities for clients and supports for daily living. We will be doubling our current program capacity

to serve even more adults who are frail, living with dementia, have a disability, chronic illness, or other conditions. This is a fee-for-service program and applications can be made through Ontario Health atHome by calling 310-2222 or 1-888-733-1177. Subsidies may be available. We are very excited to grow our innovative integrated care model to include a seniors-focused Integrated Care Centre. This clinic is for clients of ADS and will include primary care services, a neuro-behavioural nurse practitioner with geriatric sub-speciality and specialized social work services for clients and caregivers. Overnight respite care will also be part of the program offerings in the future after the new building has opened.

The History of Peel Manor

As we celebrate Peel Region’s 50th anniversary and get ready to say goodbye to the original Peel Manor, we felt it fitting to do a brief retrospective of the oldest of the Region’s five long term care homes.

1896

The Christian Women’s Temperance Union of Brampton and Port Credit pressure Peel County Council to find better accommodation than the jail for destitute individuals.

1898

Peel Manor — originally called the County of Peel House of Industry and Refuge — is built. It was run by a keeper, a matron, and a physician. In its first year it housed 12 people: 10 men and two women.

1909

Peel and Halton Regions join forces as co-owners to run the home.

1952

The Region of Peel becomes the sole owner.

1960

The centre is renamed Peel Manor in 1960. The structure is changed in the 60s by adding new nursing wings and amenities including an auditorium and chapel.

1970

The oldest part of the building is renovated in the 70s.

1980

A new wing is added with ensuite washrooms and closets in the 80s. Most of the 100 acres of land are sold in the 80s to support Brampton’s growth.

1990

From 1990-1994, resident accommodations are modernized throughout the building.

2024

The new Seniors Health and Wellness Village at Peel Manor will open.
