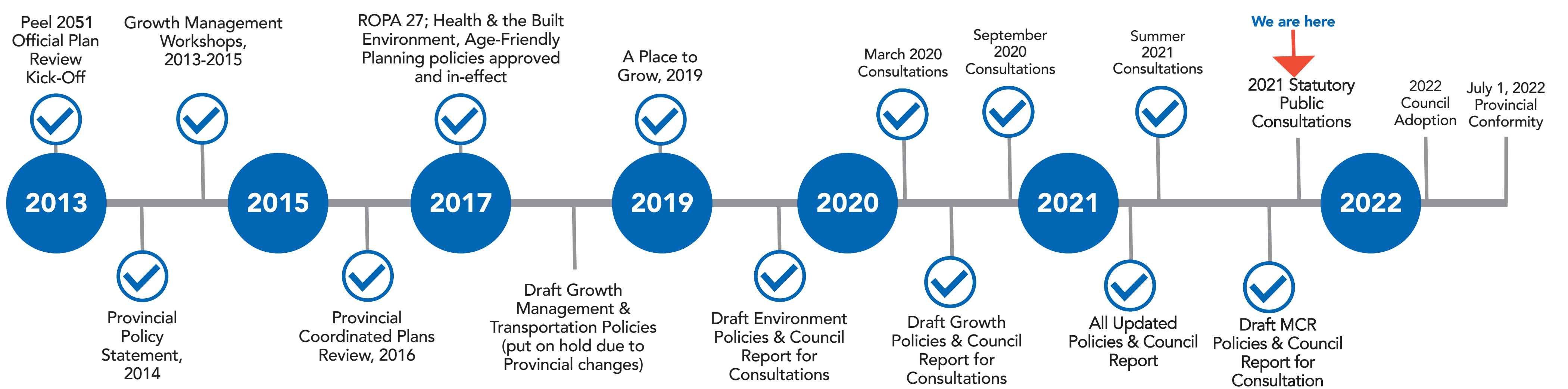
# Policy Focus Areas

# Planning at the Region of Peel

## Regional context

Situated in the heart of the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, the Region of Peel is comprised of three local municipalities: the City of Brampton, the Town of Caledon, and the City of Mississauga.

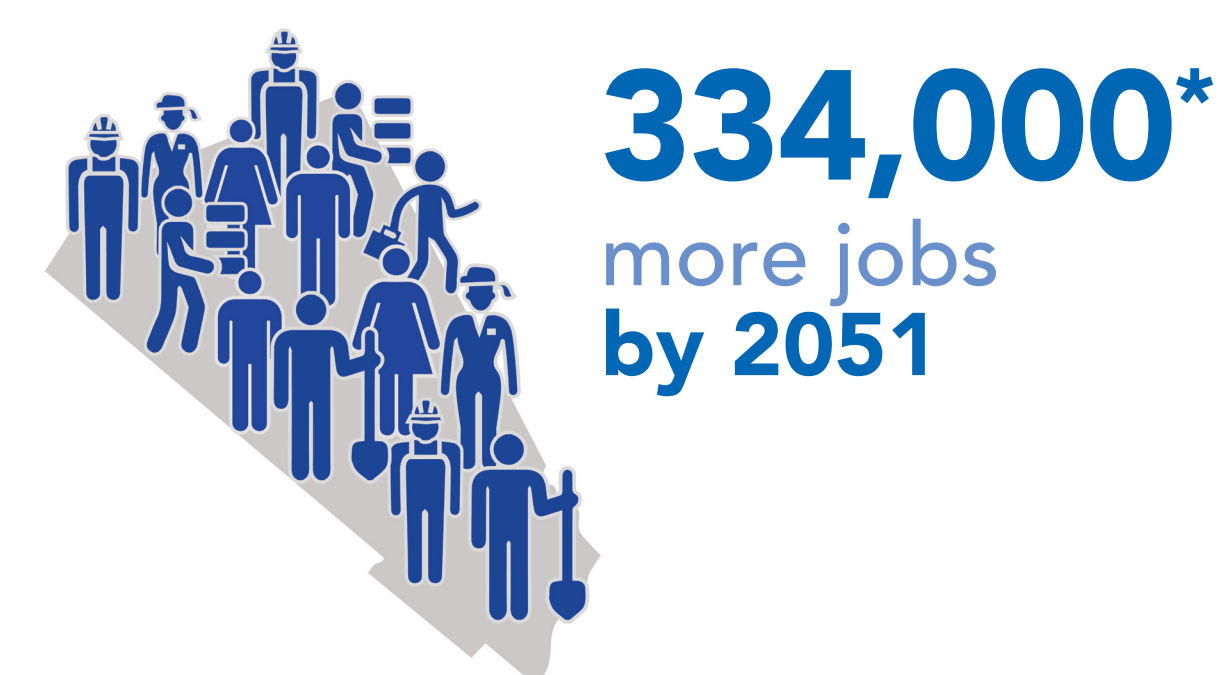
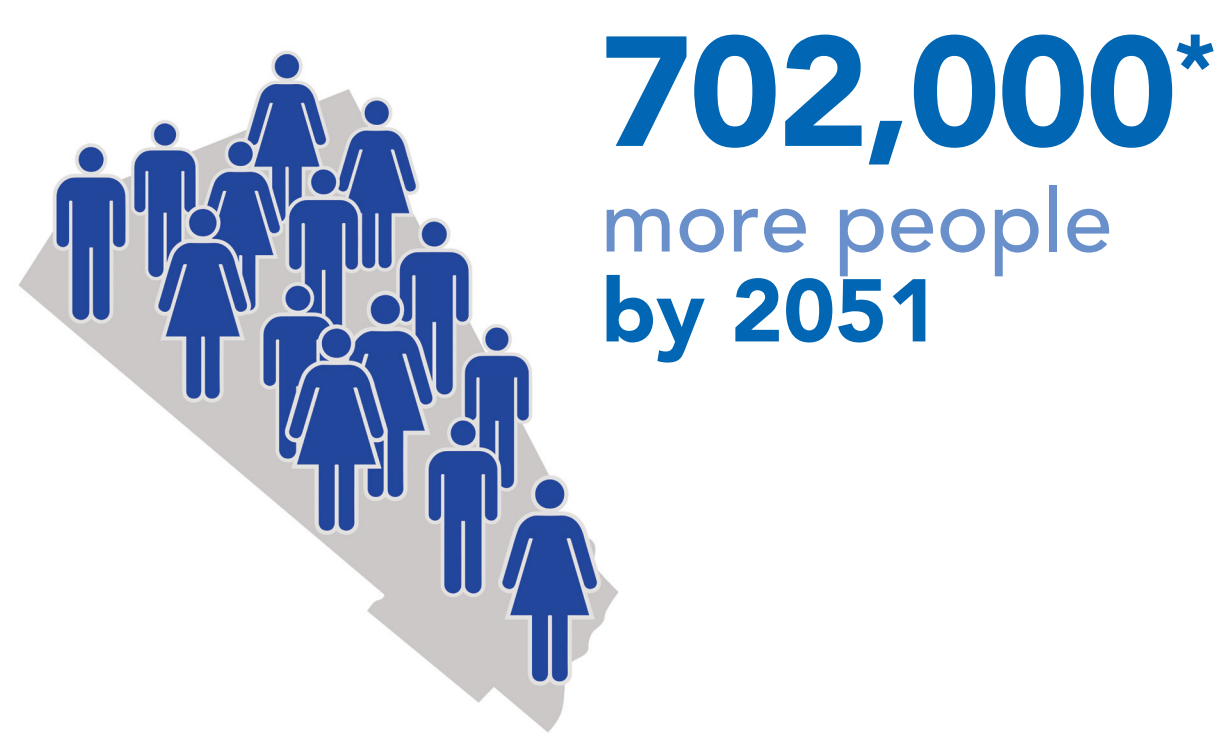
**Key policy themes** include taking action against climate change; protecting and enhancing the Region's natural heritage, and agricultural landscapes; fiscally sustainable growth; healthy, complete development of communities; increase affordable housing; changing economy and encourage job growth; and encourage active transportation.



## Regional Official Plan

The Regional Official Plan is a land use planning tool used to achieve a 'Community for Life' - a long term plan to guide future growth and development, while protecting our environment and managing resources. The Region's Official Plan reflects Provincial legislation and changing community needs. The direction set out in the Regional Official Plan guides and helps coordinate strategic planning decisions, while providing direction to local municipalities.

The Region is expected to grow and accommodate the needs of over 2 million people by 2051. This growth will be planned through the Peel 2051: Regional Official Plan Review process.
