Public Health Surveillance

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The following diseases of public health significance (Ontario Regulations 135/18 and amendments under the Health Protection and Promotion Act) are to be reported to the local Medical Officer of Health.

Diseases marked "▶" should be reported immediately to the Medical Officer of Health.

Other diseases are to be reported by the next working day.
