Water Festival Puppet Show Transcript – 10.5 min length

Narrator: Hello everyone and welcome to This is your Water Region of Peel. And now let's not waste any more time and welcome the host of the show. Girls and boys, give it up for our man Barry!

Barry: Hey, alright everyone I am Barry and welcome to the show, and what a show it promises to be. Today we're going to learn about where our drinking water comes from and how we can play a part in conserving our precious water. Hey, does anyone know what the word conservation means?
