

Personal Service Setting Convictions

Peel Public Health inspects personal service settings (e.g., businesses that provide services such as hairdressing, manicures, tattooing and ear or body piercing) for compliance with various laws including the Personal Service Settings Regulation (Reg. 136/18), Health Protection and Promotion Act, 1990, Skin Cancer Prevention Act (Tanning Beds), 2013, and Region of Peel Person Service Setting By-law. If a person fails to comply with the legislation, a charge may be laid by a public health inspector.

Below is a list of personal service settings where an offence occurred and the owner or operator was charged and convicted. Convictions will be posted for two years from the conviction date. This list was last updated on **March 25, 2026**.
